The premises is a mobile wine bar trailer which will operate in the Market Square, Market Place, Lavenham, Sudbury, Suffolk, CO10 9QZ. The trailer will be stationed within the designated horseshoe-shaped area of the car parking bays located within the Market Square. The trailer has overall dimensions of 3300mm in length (including hitch), 1920mm in width, and 2500mm in height. It will be used exclusively by staff for the preparation and service of food and drinks, including the sale and supply of alcohol. No customers will be permitted inside the trailer.

The licensed premises will also include a clearly defined raised pavement area surrounding the central war memorial and extending to the area outside the Toll House. This area will form a square-shaped outdoor space where portable tables and chairs will be provided for customers to sit and consume food and alcohol purchased from the trailer. This seating area will be arranged and supervised by staff at all times to promote a safe and welcoming environment.

A clear and unobstructed path will be maintained at all times to ensure full access to the Toll House for both the public and emergency services. The layout will be carefully managed to respect the heritage setting and preserve access and movement through the Market Square.

At the end of each trading day, the trailer will be moved off the premises, and all portable tables and seating will be packed down and removed. No structures or furniture will be left on-site overnight, ensuring the area is fully cleared and returned to its original public use.

The overall setup is designed to create a relaxed and sociable atmosphere in keeping with the historic character of Lavenham's Market Square, while upholding public safety, minimising disruption, and fully supporting the four licensing objectives.

Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

As the operator of a mobile wine bar trailer in Lavenham's Market Square, I am fully committed to promoting the four licensing objectives. Staff will be trained in responsible alcohol service, including the Challenge 25 policy, to prevent underage sales and reduce the risk of alcohol-related crime and disorder. The premises will be carefully laid out and supervised to ensure public safety, with clear access routes maintained at all times, particularly around the Toll House and war memorial. To prevent public nuisance, no music or amplified sound will be used, all waste will be cleared daily, and the trailer along with all furniture will be removed from the site each evening. As the premises is located in a public open space, children may naturally be present in the surrounding area; therefore, alcohol will only be served to responsible adults, and staff will remain vigilant to ensure no alcohol is supplied to minors. The designated seating area will be managed to remain a safe and welcoming environment for all, with particular care taken to ensure families and the general public are not exposed to inappropriate behaviour.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

To prevent crime and disorder, all staff will be fully trained in responsible alcohol service and the principles of Challenge 25. Alcohol will only be served to customers who are seated within the designated area, and no open containers will be permitted outside this space. Staff will remain present at all times to monitor customer behaviour and prevent disorderly conduct. A refusals and incident log will be maintained and made available to responsible authorities upon request. The premises will not operate late into the night, and alcohol will not be served to anyone who appears intoxicated.

c) Public safety

Public safety will be ensured by maintaining a clean, hazard-free environment. The trailer and portable furniture will be safely positioned each day with clear walkways and emergency access maintained, particularly around the war memorial and Toll House. All electrical and catering equipment within the trailer will meet safety standards and be regularly inspected. Fire safety equipment will be provided, and staff will be trained in basic first aid and emergency procedures. The trailer will be moved off-site at the end of each trading day to ensure the area remains accessible and safe overnight.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

To prevent public nuisance, noise levels will be carefully managed, with no music, amplified sound, or entertainment provided from the trailer. Trading hours will be reasonable and respectful of local residents and nearby businesses. Waste generated from the operation will be collected throughout the day and fully cleared from the site at close of business, with no litter left overnight. All tables and seating will be removed each evening. Signage will be displayed asking customers to be considerate of the surrounding area and to dispose of waste responsibly.

e) The protection of children from harm

As the premises is located in a public open space, it is expected that children may be present in the general area. Alcohol will not be sold to anyone under the age of 18, and all staff will be fully trained to apply the Challenge 25 policy consistently and confidently. Clear signage will be displayed to reinforce age verification requirements. While children may be nearby, the designated seating area will be managed to ensure it remains a safe and appropriate environment for all visitors. Staff will remain vigilant to ensure that no alcohol is consumed by underage individuals and that no inappropriate behaviour occurs within the licensed area.

 by providing with this application, copies or scanned copies of the documents which an applicant has provided, to demonstrate their entitlement to work in the UK (which do not need to be certified) as per information published on gov.uk and in guidance. 2) by providing their 'share code' to enable the licensing authority to carry out a check using the Home Office online right to work checking service (see below).

Home Office online right to work checking service.
