

NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

BABERGH DISTRICT COUNCIL (POLSTEAD FOOTPATH NO 35(PART)) PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2021

On 18 June 2024 the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs confirmed with modifications the above order made under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980.

The effect of the order as confirmed is to divert the entire width of that part of Polstead Footpath No 35 commencing at OS grid reference TM00053779 (OSGR) then proceeding in an easterly direction for approximately 11 metres to OSGR TM00073780 then in a south easterly direction for approximately 88 metres to OSGR TM00133774 then in an east south easterly direction for approximately 127 metres to join the U4319 road (Shelley Road) at OSGR TM00253769 to a new line running from OSGR TM00053779 and proceeding in a north easterly direction for approximately 15 metres to OSGR TM00073780 then in an east south easterly direction for approximately 49 metres to OSGR TM00113779 then in a south easterly direction for approximately 15 metres to OSGR TM00123778 then in a south south easterly direction for approximately 68 metres to OSGR TM00163772 then in a south easterly direction on the south west of a fence with the edge of the footpath commencing 0.5 metres from the fence for approximately 84 metres to join the U4319 road (Shelley Road) at OSGR TM00233767 as described in the order and as shown on the order map.

The order comes into force on 9 October 2024 and the old route shall be stopped up on the date that Suffolk County Council certifies that the terms of Article 1 have been complied with but if a person aggrieved by the order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the order he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within six weeks from 25 July 2024, make an application to the High Court.
