Consultation on the submission draft Baylham Neighbourhood Plan 2024 - 2037

Notice is hereby given that Baylham Parish Council have submitted their draft Neighbourhood Plan to Mid Suffolk District Council for consultation and independent examination. This draft plan sets out a vision for the parish and contains policies which it intends will be used to help determine planning applications within the designated area.

Consultation on the 'Plan Proposal'

In accordance with Regulation 16 of the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012 (as amended), Mid Suffolk District Council are consulting on this submission draft plan between Monday 10 February and Friday 28 March 2025.

Written comments are being invited from statutory consultees and from those who live, work and carry on business in the designated area (the parish) on whether or not this 'plan proposal' (the submitted Plan) meets the basic condition tests set out in Paragraph 8(2) of Schedule 4B of the Town & Country Planning Act 1990 (inserted by the Localism Act 2011).

All comments received will be made publicly available and may be identifiable by name/organisation.
