Adoption Date:	The Edgecomb Park, Stowmarket Development Brief SPD was adopted by Mid Suffolk District Council's Executive Committee on 13 th October 2014.
Area/Subject	The Stowmarket Area Action Plan (2013) allocates land off Farriers Road and Poplar Hill (Map 6.7). This area is referred to as "Edgecomb Park" in the above Development Brief. The development brief will inform decisions on planning applications for the allocation.
