Do you support someone who has used the West Suffolk Hospital virtual ward service?

We're working with the West Suffolk Foundation Trust to gather feedback about its virtual ward service. If you're a relative or unpaid family carer of a person who has used this service, please take a few moments to share your thoughts with us. Virtual wards aim to help patients receive care at home rather than in hospital. This will only happen in the short term if it's right for the patient, and people are carefully monitored using remote technology and visits to their home by hospital staff. Virtual wards are a fairly recent development in NHS care, and so it is important to ask people about their experiences to shape and influence standards of services in the future. Have you accessed care for back, neck or spinal issues in Suffolk?

We're working with the East of England Spinal Surgery Clinical Network to ask people about their experience of accessing help, treatment or support for back, neck or spinal issues in Suffolk. Please complete our short web form on this page (<u>https://healthwatchsuffolk.co.uk/spinalservices/</u>) to take part now.

You can share views if you are over the age of 16 and you have accessed help for an issue related to your back, neck or spine. For example, you might have accessed physiotherapy for spinal, back and neck pain through Allied Health Professionals in Suffolk; had surgery for a spinal issue at Ipswich hospital or used other spinal services provided by East Suffolk and North Essex Foundation Trust (ESNEFT); attended A&E with a spinal issue at West Suffolk Foundation Trust, James Paget University Hospital or ESNEFT; experienced trauma to the spine resulting in hospital care and rehabilitation, including at specialist spinal cord injury centres (like Stoke Mandeville or Sheffield); visited your GP about spinal pain and been referred for further

treatment (e.g., emergency care or pain management services, etc.); experience of treatment for scoliosis.

NHS Suffolk and North East Essex Integrated Care Board survey on plans for new combined post-viral condition services

Local people are being asked to give their views on NHS plans to combine services for those living with the post-viral conditions Myalgic Encephalomyelitis (ME), chronic fatigue syndrome (CFS) and Long COVID. By bringing these services together the Suffolk and north east Essex area will be the first in the country to offer a combined medically led service, meaning those living with a condition, their families and carers, will have access to better focused treatment and support as well as improved wellbeing. A survey has been launched to give people the opportunity to share their thoughts on the plans and how they believe services should be best shaped so that they most appropriately meet their future needs.
