Worlingworth Community Centre, Shop Street, Worlingworth, Woodbridge, Suffolk IP13 7HX, is a community village hall situated within the village of Worlingworth. The premises comprise a main hall used for functions and events, a snug/lounge area, kitchen facilities, toilets and ancillary internal areas. External areas include a patio, playing field and associated car parking.

The premises are used for community activities, meetings, classes, private hire functions and social events. Applications for licensable activities include regulated entertainment, the sale by retail of alcohol.

Alcohol for consumption on the premises will be supplied from the internal areas of the building and, on a limited number of occasions, on the patio and playing field, where permitted.

The premises are located in a village setting and will operate with appropriate measures to promote the licensing objectives, including the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm.

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that Worlingworth Community Centre has in place a Safeguarding Policy.

The Premises Licence Holder and DPS shall ensure that relevant members of staff receive and complete suitable and sufficient training to include licensing law, offences in relation to prohibited sales, and good practice in relation to the promotion of the licensing objectives, with written records retained of training undertaken and made available for inspection by the Police or an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority upon reasonable request.

For the avoidance of doubt, this training may be administered in-house or online in accordance with the relevant criteria.

The Premises Licence Holder, in partnership with the Designated Premises Supervisor, shall adopt a 'Challenge 25' proof-of-age scheme.

The Premises Licence Holder, in partnership with the Designated Premises Supervisor, shall require the production of a passport, UK photocard driving licence or PASS-accredited photocard where any individual requesting the supply of alcohol appears to be under the age of 25

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

A CCTV system shall be installed and maintained on the licensed premises, with a minimum of three cameras covering the licensed premises. Recordings shall be accurately timed and dated and shall be retained for a minimum period of 31 days. Recordings shall be made available to an authorised officer of the Police or the Licensing Authority upon request.

Notices specifying that CCTV surveillance is in operation shall be displayed prominently at the premises.

Any retention, use or disclosure of personal information captured on CCTV must be carried out in line with the data protection principles, which shall override any conflicting element of this condition.

c) Public safety

The car park shall be adequately illuminated during the hours of darkness whilst licensable activities are taking place on the licensed premises.

Notices shall be prominently displayed and maintained on the licensed premises advising of the maximum safe occupancy limit for the building. The capacity of persons on the premises shall be monitored and controlled to ensure compliance.

For events involving licensable activities, the Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that adequate provision of first aid equipment is made available, commensurate with the nature and scale of the event.

Lighting and emergency lighting shall be installed and maintained so as to ensure that good levels of visibility are maintained whilst the premises are being used for licensable activities and the public are on the premises. External lighting should be of such specification and positioning as to meet this objective without causing any public nuisance by light pollution.

The Premises Licence Holder shall implement robust hiring arrangements with all hirers, as well as for its own management committee functions, to ensure that hirers/users are clearly advised of the following, both in writing and through the Booking Secretary:

- Public safety measures;
- Emergency equipment and evacuation procedures;
- The need to ensure that attendees do not engage in any activities or conduct which may cause, or contribute towards, public nuisance or anti-social/disorderly behaviour;
- Contact telephone numbers for committee members and the caretaker;
- Premises licence terms, hours and conditions, and any limits on capacity (as may have been set under Fire Safety Regulations);
- Keeping exit routes clearly identified and free from obstruction or hazard; and
- That any fire doors are not wedged open, and that emergency lighting, exit signs and alarms are not tampered with or made inoperative whilst an event or hiring is in progress.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

During live and recorded music events the premises licence holder shall ensure that all windows and doors are kept closed after 22:00 hours save for ingress and egress from the premises.

The premises licence holder shall ensure that volume levels from both live and recorded music are monitored by a responsible person throughout the duration of the activity. Monitoring shall take place both inside and outside of the licensed premises and due regard shall be had to whether the activity may lead to excessive noise at neighbouring properties. Appropriate remedial steps shall be taken in the event of any excessive noise levels being experienced.

The premises licence holder shall ensure that all licensable activities that take place outdoors as marked on the premises licence plan ceases at 23:00 on any given day.

The premises licence holder shall ensure that close residents are kept informed of the programme of events to be held at the licensed premises. It is recommended that the programme be published on any website for the premises and be displayed and kept updated in the immediate vicinity of the premises.

During operating hours on days on which a licensed event is held, the premises licence holder or other responsible person nominated by the premises licence holder shall be available to receive and respond to nuisance-related complaints. A contact number shall be made readily available for that purpose.

The volume control of any amplification equipment being used on the licensed premises shall be kept under the direct control of the premises licence holder/manager, or another responsible individual nominated by the premises licence holder, on all occasions. At the direct request of an authorised officer of the local authority or police, the volume level shall be decreased immediately.

Waste from the licensed premises shall be removed in a timely manner (outside of the hours between 20:00hrs and 07:00hrs) to an appropriate waste disposal facility, so as to minimise the risk of public nuisance.

e) The protection of children from harm

Safeguarding Policy. The premises shall operate a safeguarding policy setting out procedures for protecting children and vulnerable persons, including reporting concerns and responding to incidents.

Designated Safeguarding Officer. A nominated Safeguarding Officer shall be responsible for safeguarding matters, receiving concerns, maintaining procedures and liaising with relevant authorities where required.

No Sale of Alcohol to Under 18s. A Challenge 25 age-verification policy shall be operated. Any person appearing to be under the age of 25 shall be required to produce acceptable photographic identification (passport, driving licence or PASS card).

Staff and Volunteer Awareness. Staff, committee members and volunteers involved in licensable activities shall be made aware of safeguarding responsibilities, age-restricted sales requirements and procedures for raising concerns.

Supervision of Children: Children under the age of 12 attending events or private functions must be accompanied and supervised by a parent, guardian, or responsible adult at all times, unless participating in an organised supervised activity. This condition shall not restrict access to the play area during normal, non-licensable use.

Restricted Access to Adult-Only Activities. Bingo sessions, or any other events restricted to persons aged 18 and over, shall be clearly identified as adults-only events, and children shall not be permitted to participate in or remain at those activities.

No Adult Entertainment. No sexual entertainment or other unsuitable adult entertainment shall be provided on the premises.

Safe Environment. Organisers shall monitor internal and external areas, including the patio and car park, to maintain a safe environment for children.

Suitable Entertainment. Events intended for families and children shall be age-appropriate. Any films or similar entertainment shall comply with relevant age classifications.

 - Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.

- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;

- any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
3. Where taking place in a building or other structure please tick as appropriate (indoors may include a tent).
 4. For example the type of activity to be authorised, if not already stated, and give relevant further details, for example (but not exclusively) whether or not music will be amplified or unamplified.
 5. For example (but not exclusively), where the activity will occur on additional days during the summer months.
 6. For example (but not exclusively), where you wish the activity to go on longer on a particular day e.g. Christmas Eve.
 7. Please give timings in 24 hour clock (e.g. 16.00) and only give details for the days of the week when you intend the premises to be used for the activity.
 8. If you wish people to be able to consume alcohol on the premises, please tick 'on the premises'. If you wish people to be able to purchase alcohol to consume away from the premises, please tick 'off the premises'. If you wish people to be able to do both, please tick 'both'.
 9. Please give information about anything intended to occur at the premises or ancillary to the use of the premises which may give rise to concern in respect of children, regardless of whether you intend children to have access to the premises, for example (but not exclusively) nudity or semi-nudity, films for restricted age groups or the presence of gaming machines.
 10. Please list here steps you will take to promote all four licensing objectives together.
 11. The application form must be signed.
 12. An applicant's agent (for example solicitor) may sign the form on their behalf provided that they have actual authority to do so.
 13. Where there is more than one applicant, each of the applicants or their respective agent must sign the application form.
 14. This is the address which we shall use to correspond with you about this application.
 15. Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be issued to an individual or an individual in a partnership which is not a limited liability partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have the right to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

They do this in one of two ways:

- 1) by providing with this application, copies or scanned copies of the documents which an applicant has provided, to demonstrate their entitlement to work in the UK (which do not need to be certified) as per information published on gov.uk and in guidance.
- 2) by providing their 'share code' to enable the licensing authority to carry out a check using the Home Office online right to work checking service (see below).

Home Office online right to work checking service.

As an alternative to providing a copy of original documents, applicants may demonstrate their right to work by allowing the licensing authority to carry out a check with the Home Office online right to work checking service.

To demonstrate their right to work via the Home Office online right to work checking service, applicants should include in this application their share code (provided to them upon accessing the service at <https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work>) which, along with the applicant's date of birth, will allow the licensing authority to carry out the check.

In order to establish the applicant's right to work, the check will need to indicate that the applicant is allowed to work in the United Kingdom and is not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

An online check will not be possible in all circumstances because not all applicants will have an immigration status that can be shared digitally. The Home Office online right to work checking service sets out what information and/or documentation applicants will need in order to access the service. Applicants who are unable to obtain a share code from the service should submit copies of documents as set out above.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.
