Adoption of Redgrave Neighbourhood Plan 2018 - 2037

Dated: 20th July 2022

Decision:

Mid Suffolk District Council has decided to 'make' (adopt) the Redgrave Neighbourhood Development Plan 2018 - 2037 as part of its statutory development plan in accordance with Regulation 19 of the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012.

The decision comes after a referendum was held in the parish at which more than half of those who voted did so in favour of the Plan being used to help determine planning applications.

Reason for decision:

Redgrave Parish Council have prepared a Neighbourhood Plan in accordance with the relevant regulations.

The Plan was independently examined by Janet Cheesley BA (Hons) DipTP MRTPI. The final report, published in September 2021, concluded that subject to modifications the Plan meets the basic conditions set out in Paragraph 8(2), Schedule 4B the Town and Country Planning Act, 1990.

On 1 March 2022, Mid Suffolk District Council published a statement confirming that the proposed modifications should be made in full and that subject to that task being satisfactorily completed, the Plan should proceed to a local referendum.

The referendum, which took place on 7 July 2022, posed the following question: 'Do you want Mid Suffolk District Council to use the neighbourhood plan for Redgrave to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?'

The declared result was:

The result means the District Council must now 'make' (adopt) the Redgrave Neighbourhood Plan unless it considers that it would be in breach of any EU obligations or any of the Convention Rights (within the meaning of the Human Rights Act 1998). The District Council is satisfied that the Plan is not in breach of these obligations.
