




- Thurston is a village with a population of approximately 3200. Key services offered in the village include shops, post office, schools, rail station and bus service.
- There is an area in the east of Thurston that is in Flood Zones 2, 3a and 3b in the Church road and stoney lane area, and also to the northeast near Manor Farm.
- BGS maps and EA groundwater vulnerability maps show Thurston to be underlain by a major aquifer with high vulnerability in the west and a minor aquifer with high vulnerability in the east, meaning that there is a potential risk of groundwater flooding. Groundwater flooding was recorded in 2001 near the railway station following prolonged heavy
- DG5 data for external and internal sewer flooding incidents has been obtained from Anglian Water which shows no occurrences of sewer flooding in Thurston.
- The development site to the east of Thurston is partly situated
- Potential development in the west of the settlement could encroach into adjoining St Edmundsbury DC.
